

USER GUIDE for Web of Science

(Social Sciences Citation Index, Arts & Humanities Citation Index)



The **Web of Science** consists of citation databases containing the references cited by the authors of the articles. You can use these references to do cited reference searching. This type of search allows you to find articles that cite a previously published work.

Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI) (1992+)

It indexes over 1,950 journals across 50 social sciences disciplines with all cited references captured from indexed articles. Some of the disciplines covered include:

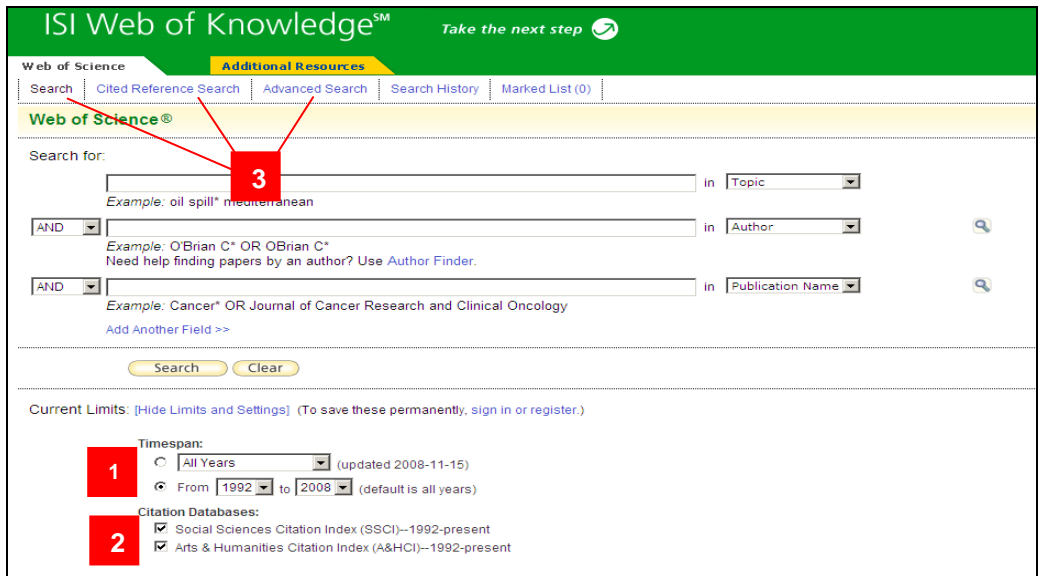
It indexes over 1,160 arts and humanities journals with all cited references captured from indexed articles. Some of the disciplines covered include:

How to Access

1. Click E-Databases at the Library’s homepage (<http://www.lib.ied.edu.hk>)
2. Click **A** or **S** under “By Alphabet”.
3. Click **Arts & Humanities Citation Index** or **Social Sciences Citation Index**.

Get Started



1. Select the timespan. The “year” refers to the year that an article information was entered into the database and not necessarily when the article was published.
2. Choose one or both citation databases.
3. Select a search option: **Search** (default screen), **Cited Reference Search** and **Advanced Search**.

Search

Search for articles by topic, author, title, journal, or author address.

Step 2 of 2: Select cited references and click "Finish Search."

Select the references for which you wish to see the citing articles, then click the "Finish Search" button.
Hint: Look for [cited reference variants](#) (sometimes different pages of the same article are cited or papers are cited incorrectly).

2. Enter the abbreviated journal title of a cited work. Join multiple titles with the search operator OR (e.g., *J Educ Policy* or *J Educ Psychol*).
3. Click **Search**.
4. On the cited references list, click the checkbox(es) to select the reference(s).
5. Click **Finish Search**.

Advanced Search

Advanced Search. Use 2-character tags, Boolean operators, parentheses, and set references to create your query. Results appear in the Search History at the bottom of the page.

Abstract: The lives of women and men, the relationships that they establish, and their work have changed dramatically, in the past 50 years, but the dominant theories driving research in these areas have not. In this article, the authors argue that the facts underlying the assumptions of the classical theories of gender and multiple roles have changed so radically, as to make the theories obsolete. Moreover, a large body, of empirical data fails to support the predictions flowing from these theories. Yet the development of new theory for guiding research and clinical practice has not kept pace. The authors attempt to fill this theoretical gap by reviewing the research literature and articulating an expansionist theory of gender, work, and family that includes four empirically, derived and empirically testable principles better matched to today's realities.
